The meeting was called to order by Chairman Greta Clark.

The minutes of the July 12 meeting were approved.

Unfinished Business:

1. Discussion of the Fall 2013 Community Engagement Partnership Program:
  - Greta Clark gave a brief summary of the Community Engagement Partnership Program and passed out the program overview as well as the application.
  - Guests Mona Ortiz and Adriana Figueroa are willing to participate in this program and invite family and friends.
  
2. Discussion of Welcoming Cities Program:
  - a. Ernestor De La Rosa gave a brief summary about what Welcoming Cities is and announced to the Board that the commitment form has been submitted to the Welcoming America Organization.
  - b. The Welcoming Cities resolution for Dodge City was presented and reviewed by the Board. The Board members were happy with the resolution. The Board was also in agreement the resolution be presented at the September 15 City Commission meeting to become an affiliate of the Welcoming Cities initiative.

## About our Speakers

Vivian Jackson, PhD is a member of the faculty of the National Center for Cultural Competence, Georgetown University Center for Child and Human Development, where she provides technical assistance and consultation related to cultural and linguistic competence for the SAMHSA Children's Mental Health Initiative. Dr. Jackson is a social worker with over 30 years of experience as a practitioner, supervisor, manager and trainer in health, mental health, substance abuse, child welfare, managed care, system reform and cultural competency.

Wendy Jones is a research instructor in the Department of Pediatrics, Georgetown University Medical Center in Washington, D.C. She has been associated with the Georgetown University Center for Child & Human Development (GUCCHD), University Centers of Excellence, for the past 18 years and has served in various capacities. She is a bilingual special educator and social worker specializing in advocacy, support, and training for individuals and families with limited English proficiency and families with developmental, educational and emotional disabilities.

Don Stull, PhD is professor of anthropology at the University of Kansas, where he has taught since 1975. He holds a doctorate in anthropology from the University of Colorado, Boulder, and a master's in public health from the University of California, Berkeley. From 1987 to 1990, Don directed a team of six social scientists in a Ford Foundation study of changing ethnic relations in Garden City, Kansas. Since then, he has worked in communities that are home to beef, pork, and poultry processing plants in Nebraska, Oklahoma, and Kentucky, as well as consulted with a number of rural communities on the plains and prairies of the United States and Canada. But no matter how far from Southwest Kansas his research has taken him, he keeps coming back to Garden City, from which he has learned so much.
