## City News

- ★ The Flag Contest, initially launched in August 2020, was put on hold momentarily but is now back for a public vote! This contest aims to adopt a new official City flag that will serve as a symbol for Dodge City and a source of civic pride. - ★ The City has recently acquired bilingual, self-service kiosks to provide an additional option for contactless payment of utility bills. The first kiosk that is now running is placed inside the Village Square Mall's main entrance at 2601 Central Ave. and can be used to make bill payments during the mall's business hours. A second kiosk will be placed on the north side of City Hall at 806 N. 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue in late April and will be available for payments at all times. Payments accepted through the kiosks include cash, check, or card. Change will not be provided for cash payments made through the kiosk, but the overpayment will be added to the account for the next billing cycle. Customers will need to have their paper bill or account number with them when using the kiosk.
- ★ Angela Unruh was recently appointed by the City of Dodge City and Ford County Commissions to serve a three-year term on the Community Facility Advisory Board (CFAB). She will replace Ryan Rabe, whose second three-year term ended recently. The next regularly scheduled meeting will be on Tuesday, March 30 at 6:30 pm in the City Commission Chambers at City Hall, located at 806 N. 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue.




## Department Updates

- ★ With all the moisture recently, we are seeing a plethora of potholes forming throughout town. Street crews are working to repair potholes as soon as possible; however, looking for all of them can take up quite a bit of time. Residents can also help us make these repairs faster by reporting potholes in their area by contacting Public Works at 620-225-8170 or going online and submitting a report at <https://www.dodgecity.org/RequestTracker.aspx>.
- ★ Athletic Field Maintenance has been prepping all the soccer fields at St. Mary's, adding millings east of the YMCA, and maintaining the ballfields throughout the city parks.



- ★ Forestry and Landscape have been doing a lot of work downtown and in the Liberty Garden to ensure the flower beds are ready for the spring.
- ★ Parks has begun prep work for the Long Branch Lagoon Waterpark season with painting. They have also been finishing up a few projects at the racetrack.
- ★ Construction has been working a lot at the racetrack and Hennessey Hall to add HVAC to specific spaces. A few team members participated in training and walk-thru for operating and maintaining generators located at city facilities.
- ★ Mariah Hills has seen an increase of over 200 rounds played compared to this time in 2020. There are several new items in the Pro Shop, including new Ping golf bags with the Mariah Hills logo. The team at Mariah Hills will begin the greens aerification process next week.
- ★ Sports and Events will have at least eight sanctioned tournaments in 2021, including the USSSA 14B Super Regional, which will see 35 teams traveling to Dodge City from several states.
- ★ Each year, the City of Dodge City employees partake in either First aid or CPR training. This ensures that employees are receiving the most up-to-date information on these important topics. This year, staff participated in CPR training at the Hoover Pavilion, taught by certified Dodge City Fire Department members.
- ★ The Dodge City Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB) has been busy with the influx of visitors at the Visitor Information Center during March and processing numerous information requests for the upcoming summer! Along with Spring Break travel, Dodge City has been busy with several events that have come to town; USAKS Kids District 4 Wrestling Tournament on March 6, KSHSAA State Basketball Class 1A from March 11-13, 3i SHOW during March 18-20, and USAKS Wrestling National Recruiting Showcase on March 20. The CVB welcomed the first bus group of the year with Gannon Tours on March 23! On March 25 and 26th, Channel 9 News from Oklahoma City came into town to shoot a segment for their "Trips on a Tankful" special that will air this spring.



## Project Updates

- ★ The City of Dodge City continues to progress on the Downtown Streetscape project and is currently under design review by the Kansas State Historical Society. Partially funded through Sales Tax & Revenue (STAR) Bonds, this project will revitalize the heart of downtown and be a significant draw for visitors and locals. It will also replace aging infrastructure (water, gas, electric, storm sewer, & sanitary sewer) to accommodate the future needs of downtown and complement the new Boot Hill Museum expansion project. It is anticipated that the project will begin in the winter of 2021/2022.

- ★ City Commissioners and City Staff will be meeting with the Kansas Legislative Delegation in Liberal, Kansas, on Monday, March 29, 2021. Staff from the Kansas Delegation will provide a legislative update on various legislative issues and will meet individually with each of the Southwest Kansas cities, followed by a reception. The City of Dodge City hopes to discuss Air Transportation, Immigration, USDA, Renewable Energy, and other important topics in these meetings.

- ★ The City of Dodge City, along with the Dodge City Family YMCA, United Wireless Arena, StandGuard Aquatics/Long Branch Lagoon, and the Dodge City Raceway Park, will host a Job Fair on Tuesday, April 6 at the Hoover Pavilion (108 4th Avenue) 1-6 pm. The event titled 'City of Dodge City: Chats' will allow community members to come and have open discussion with the City's staff as well as have an opportunity to tour and learn about the numerous facilities that the different departments operate.
- ★ The Keep Dodge City Beautiful Great American Clean Up event, along with an open house, will be held on April 24, 2021, at the new CREW building located at 124 N 14th Ave from 10 am to 1 pm. Partners in attendance for the event include Ford County's House Hold Hazardous Waste trailer, the Archway E-waste Recycling trailer, The Dodge City Police Department's unwanted/outdated prescription medications drop-off, and the Ford County Humane Society will be accepting donations. Residents are encouraged to bring their recycling at that time, and while they are there, enjoy some refreshments and visit with staff about any questions they might have about recycling.

**Dodge City/Ford County Development Corp first to complete  
Sunflower's site certification process**

*Certification a green light for industrial developers*

Hays, Kan.—March 18, 2021— Stamped for approval! The Dodge City Business Park became a certified site, which verifies that the 245-acre business park meets necessary criteria for industrial development. On March 11, the Dodge City/Ford County Development Corporation was the first organization to complete the site certification process through the Sunflower Electric Power Corporation Certified Sites Program.

“I am excited to have the Dodge City Business Park certified as an approved, developable site under the Sunflower program. The thoroughness of their process brings great credibility to our site and community,” said Joann Knight, executive director for the Dodge City/Ford County Development Corporation.

Sunflower developed its certified sites program to spotlight the quality industrial opportunities within its members' service territory spanning central and western Kansas. To obtain the certification, a community must gather a comprehensive list of criteria on a potential land site, such as site characteristics, utility infrastructure, site availability and price.

“Having the due diligence completed on these sites in advance adds a competitive edge to a community's effort to respond to potential opportunities,” said Nikki Pfannenstiel, Sunflower's manager of member services, “and saves time for the business developer because there are no surprises with sites that are fully vetted.”

A benefit of the Sunflower Certified Sites Program is an independent third-party review of a site's potential for industrial opportunities.

Chad Sayre, vice president at Allstate Consultants who performed the independent review, applauded Sunflower's rural development program.

“It has been a pleasure to work with the Sunflower team and their member communities to refine the Sunflower Certified Sites Program criteria and provide an engineering and technical view of the potential these great sites possess,” Sayre said. “Sunflower is

### Bison Exhibit Coming to Boot Hill Museum

Beginning February 24, through April 4, Boot Hill Museum will host Bison, a traveling exhibit featuring a cultural and natural history of the American Bison.

Bison explores the significance of bison in the cultures of Plains Indian peoples—particularly as a resource for food, clothing, shelter, and tools. That coexistence changed dramatically with the closing of the frontier that brought new settlers with livestock to compete for grass and water during a time of climate and habitat change. These developments were exacerbated by the commodification of the bison as hide and bone in late nineteenth century industrialization. For 35 years the Kauffman Museum has curated, designed, and fabricated special exhibitions to share beyond their home in the central plains

The exhibit will be on display in the Mariah Gallery located just off the lobby of the new expansion at Boot Hill Museum. A big component of the STAR Bond expansion was the ability to bring new and exciting content and exhibits to Dodge City and the surrounding communities. The STAR Bond expansion was a project that included Boot Hill Museum, the City of Dodge City, and the Kansas Department of Commerce. “This will be the first of many traveling exhibits that will be brought to our visitors.” Executive Director of Boot Hill Museum Lara Brehm said, “Our hope is that visitors of all ages will come and enjoy all Boot Hill Museum, and Dodge City has to offer!”

Boot Hill Museum would also like to give special thanks to the Community Foundation of Southwest Kansas for their support of the exhibits scheduled to be on display in 2021. Bison will be included with general admission to the museum. Boot Hill Museum would like to remind all Ford County Residents that admission is free with proof of residence.

Clients entering this service are monitored 24-hrs a day and will initially be isolated as a pandemic precaution. Currently, regular residential clients are tested prior to entering the facility and are subject to masking requirements and social distancing upon admission. If they test positive, they

are given the option to go to the local hotel provided by the county for positive cases or to return home. New Chance is also currently providing Out-Patient services in-person or via Zoom based on the client's choice. Masking protocols and social distancing are in place for in-person Out-Patient as well. 

# LET'S TALK ABOUT COVID-19 VACCINES ...

## WHEN AND WHERE WILL I GET A VACCINE?

Doses available to Kansas are in low supply. **The state of Kansas has prioritized "phases" of vaccination, with those most at-risk of serious illness or death in the first phases.** Each county determines eligibility within each phase. For vaccine locations, check with:

- Your local county health department
- Health clinic or your doctor
- Retail pharmacies

You will need two doses of the vaccine – after the initial dose, you will be told when to return for the second.

## HOW MUCH WILL THE VACCINES COST?

**The shot is free, but some health care providers might charge an administration fee, which likely will be covered by your insurance or for the uninsured.** Health officials say no one will be turned away because of inability to pay.

## WILL THE VACCINE MAKE ME SICK?

**The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) says the COVID-19 vaccines cannot give you COVID-19,** because they do not contain the live virus that causes the disease. Common side effects may include pain or redness at the injection site, fever, headache, chills, muscle and joint pain. Most happened after the second dose.

## DO I NEED TO GET THE VACCINE IF I'VE ALREADY HAD COVID-19?

**Yes, CDC recommends that you get vaccinated even if you have already had COVID-19,** because you can get the virus more than once. While you may have some short-term antibody protection after recovering from COVID-19, we don't know how long this protection will last.



## WHAT SHOULD I CONTINUE TO DO BEFORE AND AFTER I GET THE VACCINE?

With limited supplies, it may be a while before everyone can be vaccinated. Whether you've been vaccinated or not, health experts suggest you continue to follow these important steps to slow the spread of COVID-19:

- **Wear a mask**
- **Wash your hands often**
- **Distance yourself from others**
- **If you are sick, get tested**
- **Make a plan to get the vaccine when it's your turn**
  - Find your phase and available vaccine sites (*your county health department, community clinic or doctor or retail pharmacies*)
  - Ask what you will need for your vaccine appointment
- **Right now, you can help your family, friends, neighbors or coworkers find a vaccine location.**

# ¡PONTE LA VACUNA CONTRA EL COVID-19 PARA QUE PODAMOS VOLVER A BAILAR!

Las vacunas de COVID-19 ya están aquí: son seguras, gratuitas y para todos. Pero las fases de distribución de la vacuna contra COVID-19 todavía tomarán meses para concluir. Sí, sabemos que esto no es fácil. ¡Pero hagamos este sacrificio por unos meses más para que podamos bailar juntos otra vez! Todos pueden recibir la vacuna contra el COVID.



## ¿CUÁNDO Y DÓNDE RECIBIRÉ LA VACUNA?

Las dosis inicialmente disponibles para los habitantes de Kansas están disponibles en forma muy limitada, **de manera que los esfuerzos de planificación se basan en la disponibilidad de vacunas en las diferentes fases.** A medida que la disponibilidad aumente, las vacunas se ofrecerán a todos los pobladores de Kansas y serán distribuidas en lugares convenientes:

- Departamento de Salud del Condado
- Clínica o consultorio del doctor
- Farmacias

Se necesitan dos dosis de la vacuna, después de la dosis inicial, se te dirá cuándo regresar para recibir la segunda dosis.

## ¿ESTARÁN LAS VACUNAS DISPONIBLES PARA LA COMUNIDAD INDOCUMENTADA?

Sí, las vacunas contra el COVID-19 estarán disponibles para la comunidad indocumentada. Los proveedores de salud no deben discriminar. Se puede requerir alguna información personal, y esta información personal es diferente en cada lugar. Aunque el miedo a dar información personal es una realidad en la comunidad indocumentada, es importante buscar información de parte de los aliados de la comunidad.

## ¿CUÁNTO CUESTA LA VACUNA?

**La vacuna es gratuita, tanto si tiene seguro de salud, como si no lo tiene.** Sin embargo, los proveedores de vacunas podrán cobrar una tarifa administrativa por la vacuna, si no tuvieses cobertura de salud. Esto será variable en cada estado.

## ¿PUEDO ENFERMarme AL RECIBIR LA VACUNA?

**El Centro para Control de Enfermedades (CDC, por sus siglas en inglés) dice que la vacuna contra el COVID-19 no puede hacer que te enfermes de COVID-19, porque no contiene el virus vivo que causa la enfermedad.** Los efectos secundarios comunes pueden incluir dolor o enrojecimiento en el área en que fue aplicada la inyección, fiebre, dolor de cabeza, escalofríos, dolor muscular y de las articulaciones.

## ¿NECESITO RECIBIR LA VACUNA SI YA HE TENIDO COVID-19?

Sí. El Centro para Control de Enfermedades (CDC, por sus siglas en inglés) recomienda que te vacunes aún si ya has tenido COVID-19, porque el virus se puede adquirir más de una vez. Aún cuando debe dejar una corta protección de anticuerpos después de recuperarse del COVID-19, no sabemos cuánto puede durar esta protección.

## ¿QUÉ DEBO HACER ANTES Y SEGUIR HACIENDO DESPUÉS DE RECIBIR LA VACUNA?

Dependiendo de la disponibilidad, podrían pasar meses antes de que muchos pobladores de Kansas puedan recibir la vacuna. Mientras tanto, será esfuerzo de todos en el estado disminuir la propagación de COVID-19. Aquí hay cosas importantes que puedes hacer:

- Usar una mascarilla
