1. The Liberty Gardens Committee and the City of Dodge City would like to thank all of those that attended the 17th Annual 9.11 Day of Remembrance Memorial Ceremony. The committee also expresses their gratitude to Fidelity State Bank, Western Beverage and CREW Recycling for donating the trees planted in during the morning ceremonies. The service is held to remember those who lost their lives during the terrorist attack on September 11, 2001, and those servicemen and women who have given their lives and who continue to serve in the fight on terrorism. The Liberty Garden Committee is made up of Jeff Myers, Lori Bone, and Jane Longmeyer, and Corey Keller as the City Staff Representative.



2. City staff has been attending meetings in preparation for the Historic Preservation conference that will be held next week at the Santa Fe Depot, September 19-21. 3. City, County, and VenuWorks Administration met with representatives from the High Plains Youth Hockey Association on Wednesday to discuss the efforts to extend the 2019/2020 season. In addition, they discussed needs and concerns from the association.

4. City Staff and City Commissioners attended the Southwest Kansas Coalition (Dodge City, Garden City, and Liberal) annual meeting in Liberal, Kansas. As part of the meeting, SKC members discussed the SKC budget for the fiscal year 2020; received State legislative updates for the last and next Kansas legislative session; and agreed on the upcoming legislative agenda for 2020, which included the topics of immigration, education, transportation, taxation, and annexation. The group also had a special guest from the Kansas Department of Transportation, which spurred the conversation on road and infrastructure projects in Southwest Kansas.



5. The Boot Hill Museum construction meeting was held this week. The aluminum windows and doors are close to completion, and it is anticipated that glass will go in next week. In addition, the canopy on the north side of the building will be installed the first week of October. Currently, the siding is being installed on the north side of the building.

6. Last week, Dodge City Latino/Hispanic leaders and residents attended a listening session with Aude Negrete, Director of the Kansas Hispanic & Latino American Affairs Commission with the Kansas Governor's Office. As part of the meeting, the group talked about issues and successes of the Latino/Hispanic community in Dodge City and the State of Kansas. The goal of these listening sessions is to bring these issues to the Governor's attention in hopes of solutions that will improve diverse communities like Dodge City and Garden City.



7. City administration attended an ICMA Webinar on Grappling with Gnarly Issues this week. The webinar focused on different issues facing cities and the innovative approaches that their administration came up with to tackle these problems.
8. Parks and Facilities staff spent a few days this week removing and replacing soil on the south side of the employee parking lot at City Hall. New sod is being placed Friday, September 13th, which will complete the project. The lawn on the west side of the parking lot was replaced in July.



9. The streets department has spent the majority of the week removing the brick guttering and replacing it with 8" of concrete on the east side of Ave D and Military. The west side of the intersection was repaired last year due to rainfall.

10. Parks and Facilities Sports and Events Coordinator Michael Harris attended the Tomorrow's Leaders Institute held earlier this week at the Tall Oaks Conference Center east of Linwood, KS. The institute, held annually by the Kansas Parks and Recreation Association, is a two and a half-day training geared toward parks and recreation professionals who are just getting started in their careers. The training focuses on enhancing leadership qualities, management knowledge, and networking with other parks and recreation professionals. Following the conclusion of the training, Troy Brown, Parks and Facilities director received an email from Erika Devore, Executive Director of KRPA. Erika said this about Michael, "Every year at our Tomorrow's Leaders Institute, we have a few attendees really stand out as future leaders in the park and recreation profession. This year Michael showed us he has the leadership skills to excel in this profession. We enjoyed having him attend and look forward to watching him advance throughout his career". Congratulations to Michael for being recognized by KRPA and for being a great addition to the Parks and Facilities team.



11. Dodge City has been host to several events this week. The Ford County EMS has prepared for three nights of continuing education classes. The Dodge City Senior High class of 1959 is celebrating their reunion. The annual Southwest Kansas Bar Association was held Friday, September 13th at the Depot Theater Company with the help of the Dodge City Depot Guild.

12. The Dodge City Convention & Visitors Bureau has been busy at the Kansas State Fair this week. The CVB has had the opportunity to visit with thousands of people who visit the fair about visiting Dodge City. With the assistance of our community partners, Dodge City will have participated in the ten fun-filled days of the state fair for the 19th year.
13. Visitors to the Santa Fe Depot will be able to find out more information on the building thanks to new signs placed in the Hotel Lobby. The four signs “The Early Years,” “The Santa Fe Depot,” “The Harvey House,” and “The Restoration” tell the history of the building and its impact to Dodge City.

Tufted Capuchin Monkey Recovers from Surgery While Investigation Continues

DODGE CITY, Ks. — Wright Park Zoo and City staff previously released information that an older Tufted Capuchin Monkey, Vern, was found with minor injuries the same morning it was reported that another Capuchin from the Zoo's troop, Pickett, was located just outside City Limits. After further veterinary treatment, it was found that the injury was more extensive than it initially appeared and would require surgery. When originally reported on, it was not yet determined how Pickett came to be outside the enclosure or how Vern was injured.

"Based on DCPD's investigation as of today, we do not believe the little monkey, Pickett, found his way outside the enclosure on his own," said Dodge City Police Chief Drew Francis. "Nor do we believe he traveled to where he was found on his own. His father's injury appears to be from blunt force trauma in excess of what would occur from a fall."

Officers conducting the investigation suspect that someone gained access to the enclosure and injured the older monkey as he tried to protect his offspring from being taken.

Hannah Schroder, Head Zookeeper said, "Vern is very protective of the younger monkey and would not have let him go without a fight. Unfortunately, this suspected altercation resulted in a broken knee cap."

After many discussions with the Zoo's contracted veterinarian, Dr. Jennifer Wipf, it was decided that the "best course of action for recovery was for Vern to be transferred to Kansas State University for surgery," Schroder said.

Surgery was performed on September 10, 2019, by veterinary and orthopedic specialists at Kansas State University to repair the broken bones and was deemed successful.

"Vern is recovering well but will have to spend the next 6-8 weeks away from his family while he recovers," Schroder said. "He is back at the zoo and will remain behind the scenes until his injuries are healed."

While Vern recovers, the investigation into the incident continues, Francis said.

"Though I doubt the culprit has the decency to come forward," Francis said. "I also suspect someone may know who committed this act or have an idea who would do this. If that's you, we would greatly appreciate talking with you."

Vern came to the Wright Park Zoo in 1988 with a female named Charro at 1-year. The pair has had at least four offspring and live with their two youngest sons, Jack and Pickett. Capuchin monkeys are native to South America and live mostly in trees, only coming to the ground occasionally for food and water. Their populations are declining in the wild as they face threats of deforestation, habitat loss, and capture for the pet trade.



Ford County Community Assessment (FCCA)

- This assessment, a collaboration of Ford County K-State Research and Extension, Ford County Health Department, Western Plains Medical Complex and Hospice of the Prairie will give this coalition of partners, from varying human services, a look at the health and well-being of Ford County individuals and families.
- The primary goal of the FCCA is to identify the relationship between the needs, assets, and demographics in communities. Also, we strive to make this information available to service organizations (data for writing grants, providing resources, etc.)
- A survey has been developed to capture demographic data and information regarding well-being of Ford County families and include questions regarding: health, education, employment, social well-being, and safety.
- Data gathering methods will include online surveys, focus groups, and face to face interviews, where possible.
- This survey will be disseminated to broad sections of Ford County. Researchers are targeting representative groups of varying ages, socio-economic backgrounds, ethnic backgrounds, and religious affiliations.

- Survey responses will be anonymous and participants will not be asked any identifying information.
