1. City Hall, Municipal Court, and Convention & Visitors Bureau offices will be closed on Wednesday, December 25, and Wednesday, January 1, for the holidays.

Sanitation services for Dodge City customers will remain as scheduled on the eve holidays. Wednesday routes will be picked up on Thursday. Make sure that polycarts are placed at the curb by 7:00 am, and all trash bagged and securely tied.

Public transportation services will close at 1:00 pm on December 24 and will be closed all day on December 25 and January 1.

CREW will be closed all day on December 25 and January 1. However, the 24-hour bins for drop-off at the recycling center and Civic Center are always available. As a note, gift boxes are accepted for recycling; wrapping paper is not.

The location to dispose of real Christmas trees is just east of the dog park in Wright Park. All decorations, tinsel, stands, and plastic covers must be removed.

2. Dodge City Convention and Visitors Bureau Director Jan Stevens celebrated her upcoming retirement on Thursday, December 19th. Jan was presented a letter written by Senator Roberts and a plaque from the City of Dodge City and the Dodge City Commissioners. Jan has worked for the City of Dodge City for 13 years and will work till her last day of December 31st.



3. City and Boot Hill Museum staff attended the bi-monthly construction meeting on the expansion project. The project is nearing completion. The next meeting will be held in the New Year.
4. City Commissioners and staff attended the 10th anniversary at Boot Hill Casino and Resort on Tuesday. At the Celebration, Mayor Brian Delzeit presented Clark Stewart, President/CEO of Butler National Casino Management, with the White Hat Award for Tourism Excellence. Boot Hill Casino was the first recipient of this distinguished award which will be awarded in the future on an annual basis to a tourism entity or business in the Dodge City community.
5. City staff attended the Ford County Community Coalition meeting this week at Western Plains Medical Complex. The purpose of the meeting was to share information and receive updates from the Coalition board. The board is in the process of establishing an education committee and updating a community resource guide.

6. Attached in this newsletter is a write up detailing the history of George Hoover, one of Dodge City's first residents and the town's first elected mayor. This piece of our City's history was researched and written by Nancy Jo Trauer, former Dodge City Mayor and CVB Director.

7. Staff from Parks and Facilities and Public Works attended an Occupational Safety Health Administration (OSHA) training at Mariah Hills this past week. The instructor was Shane Etzold, a safety consultant with the Kansas Department of Labor. The course covered various safety topics that apply to numerous jobs that staff perform.



8. Main Street Dodge City attended the Kansas Main Street Program roundtable discussion, in Emporia, Kansas. The discussion was focused on the re-launching of the program. Kansas Main Street closed in 2012 with 26 Main Street community members. The original 26 communities are being grandfathered into the program, one of those being Main Street Dodge City. Various state government entities were present to explain how their organizations can be resources for Main Street. Those in attendance included Patty Clark Deputy Secretary with the Department of Commerce; The Office of Rural Prosperity; Kansas Creative Arts Industries Commission; Kansas Historical Society; NetWork Kansas; Kansas Department of Commerce; and Kansas Travel and Tourism as well as some of the original 26 Main Street communities. We are excited to see the program being reinstated and the opportunities it will bring for Main Street Dodge City.

9. The new traffic signals were installed this week at the Central Ave. and Comanche St. Intersection. Speaking of this intersection, the contractor is going to open the closed lanes for the holidays. Work will start back up on the northeast corner after the New Year.

Concrete continues to be placed on the 800 block of Central Ave. The parking lane on the west side of the street and the concrete base for the brick pavers remain to be placed. The brick layers will be in town to place the brick pavers after the concrete base has the necessary cure time. Central Ave. Reconstruction is nearing the finish line and should be completed in January.

The Hawk Pedestrian Signals are operational at both Central and Sacred Heart Schools; please obey the signals when they are operating. You can watch this YouTube video from Thornton, Co. as a reminder on HAWK Pedestrian Signals work and what drivers and pedestrians proceed through the cross-walk when the signal is operating; <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Ay4UPCwIi7A>.

The School Zone on Central Ave. is still in place; there are school zone signs at all the side streets indicating the school zone. Please keep this in mind when school resumes after the New Year.

10. The last two pieces of the Quietzone puzzle are falling into place to put an end to the blowing of train horns along the mainline tracks through town.

The first piece was the installation of signal preemption by BNSF at the 14th Ave. railroad crossing just south of Wyatt Earp Blvd. earlier this month. This allows the railroad crossing to communicate with the traffic signal controller at the street intersection to clear out northbound traffic before the gate arms drop on the rails.

The second piece is updating of the United States Department of Transportation crossing inventory forms for each crossing included in the quietzone. This required updated traffic counts and physical attributes (signing, lights, preemption, etc.) of all crossings included in the quietzone. These forms were sent off to the Kansas Department of Transportation to be officially reviewed and accepted, and are expected to be approved this week.

Once the updated crossing inventories are approved, a Notice of Establishment for a quietzone will be mailed off to all the necessary parties (Federal Railroad Administration, KDOT, BNSF, etc.), and the quietzone can come into effect 21 days after the mailing date.

If all goes to plan with the inventory forms, the quietzone should be officially established sometime in January 2020.

Department of Transportation Approves SkyWest

DODGE CITY, Ks. — The City of Dodge City received word from the United States Department of Transportation, announcing that the proposal from SkyWest Airlines, operating as United Express, was approved as the next Essential Air Service Provider for Dodge City Regional Airport starting in February 2020.

SkyWest will operate twelve weekly flights from Dodge City Regional Airport to Denver International airport. A flight schedule is still being finalized, and the airline will be releasing more information in the next few weeks as tickets become available to purchase.

“We are very excited to have jet service back in Dodge City,” said Corey Keller, City of Dodge City Director of Public Works/Airport Manager. “This is something we have been working to be ready for a few years now, the runway reconstruction project being a big part of it.”

A selection committee from the City of Dodge City interviewed and reviewed EAS proposals earlier in the year, selecting SkyWest as the recommendation to be sent to USDOT for final approval.

City seeking applications for advisory boards and commissions

DODGE CITY, Kansas — The City of Dodge City is seeking applications from Dodge City residents to fill vacant/expired terms on the city-appointed boards and commissions. The boards and commissions serve to make the city government reflective of the attitudes and beliefs of its residents.

Applications for the following boards/commissions will be accepted until 5 pm on Monday, December 23rd: Airport Advisory Board, Building Board of Appeals, Convention & Visitors Bureau Advisory Board (2 representing hospitality, and 1 at-large), Cultural Relations Advisory Board, Dodge City Planning Commission, Dodge City Public Library Board, Golf Advisory Board, Historic Landmark Commission, Parks & Recreation Advisory Board, Recycling Advisory Board, and Santa Fe Community Corrections Advisory Board.

If more applications are received than there are available positions, the applications will be kept on file in the event an opening occurs during the year. Appointments will be made at the January 6, 2020, City Commission meeting.

George Hoover

Hoover was one of Dodge City's first residents and the town's first elected mayor. Both Hoover and his partner, John McDonald, were Canadian immigrants. They established one of Dodge City's first saloons on the western edge of the Fort Dodge Military Reservation June 1872...a few months before the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway lay track into a small settlement first called "Buffalo City" and later "Dodge City." (A) (B)

Hoover married Margaret in 1876. Margaret and George were childless but raised a foster son, George Curry, who became one of the Roosevelt Rough Riders and first territorial governor of New Mexico. (C)

Hoover's saloon business evolved into a wholesale and cigar store where gambling or dancing were not allowed. He also was President of Dodge City's first commercial bank...a position he held until he died. He was several times Dodge City's mayor, served in the state legislature and as a county commissioner at various times. (D) (E) (F)

Hoover was an astute businessman and at his death in 1914, left an endowment of \$100,00 to the City of Dodge City...the proceeds which are still used today for city beautification. He is quoted as saying, "I made my money in Dodge, and I'll leave it here." (G) (H)

(A) George Merritt Hoover (August 8, 1847-July 14, 1914) was born August 8, 1847 in Caistorville, Lincoln County, Ontario, Canada. Per Dykstra/Manfra, Dodge City and the Birth of the Wild West, "Hoover came from a hardscrabble Ontario farm just west of Niagara Falls. His was a troubled household. When he was twelve, his mother, suffering from postpartum psychosis, slashed her throat with a kitchen knife. At age twenty-one, disgusted with his father's economic fecklessness, Hoover left home, carrying only 'an axe over his shoulder,' as family tradition has it. In 1869 he passed through Detroit, then followed the Wabash River into central Indiana. There the 1870 census-taker identified him as a 'common laborer.'" And Per Dykstra/Manfra, "For two years Hoover trekked southwestward across Indiana and Illinois to St Louis, where he and a former Pony Express rider—familiar with the territory to the West—decided to open a saloon in frontier Kansas. They followed the railroad survey to Fort Dodge, then to Sitler's land in present day Dodge City in June 1872." (Note: Probably Dykstra is referring to John McDonald, Hoover's business partner, as the Pony Express rider.) Before the ATSF Railroad built into the area September 1872, Hoover and McDonald set up a tent saloon on the western edge of the military reservation June 17, 1872. It immediately became a lucrative business due to the sale of liquor banned by the military within the reservation boundaries and a growing buffalo hide trade in the area.

(B) Eventually, the business moved north of the railroad tracks. A few years later Hoover bought McDonald's share of the business. Two accounts regarding McDonald's leaving the business are...Fred Young, The Delectable Berg, stated that McDonald and Hoover

hauled lumber from Hays City to make a frame building with a canvas roof located just south of the RR tracks (still under construction alongside the Santa Fe Trail) and just west of what later became Bridge Street. By November 1873, they purchased land on Front Street north of the RR tracks...(between present day 2nd ave and 1st ave)... facing south and began a retail-wholesale whiskey operation.” Per Young, “Some say McDonald was Hoover’s half-brother. Perhaps he was, since the two soon quarreled as relatives often do, and McDonald left Dodge City never to return.” Per Dykstra/Manfra, Dodge City and the Birth of the Wild West, pg 193 note 30..“John McDonald became a heavy drinker and had to be let go sometime before October 1876.”

(C) Hoover and his wife, Margaret (Carnaham) Hoover (b. 1852), married in 1876. Margaret accompanied her parents to Dodge City from Blanchester, Ohio in 1875. Per some accounts Margaret raised flowers and maintained a greenhouse at their home at 100 Military.

(D) Hoover’s “G.M. Hoover Wholesale Wines Liquors and Cigars” became the largest liquor dealer in western Kansas. But in 1885, when the Kansas Legislature passed a tougher Prohibition law, Hoover closed his liquor business. Before this, he’d already diversified his business interests.

(E) In 1882, Hoover became interested in purchasing cattle but that never developed so he moved to organizing Dodge City’s first Bank (forerunner of Fidelity State Bank & Trust Co.) along with some other investors. He held the position of bank president many years until his death in 1914. He also purchased a flour mill, called the Sunset Roller Mills.

**Per Schillingberg, Dodge City, The Early Years, 1872-1886, pg 292, in reference to Hoover’s failed attempt to purchase a herd of cattle as an investment: “Not willing to spend time feeling sorry for himself, Hoover moved on to a fresh scheme. Riding around town in a beer wagon bedecked with the Anheuser-Busch logo (a vehicle he loaned for picnics and Sunday School parties), Hoover worked on plans of opening a bank.” Previous to the Bank of Dodge City formation, local businesses such as Wright, Beverly & Company...and Hoover, himself...informally handled banking matters. His fellow bank investors were Richard Evans, Herman Fringer and Henry Sitler and William Harris...all Dodge City entrepreneurs from the early days.”

(F) He was Dodge City’s first elected mayor, an office he held multiple times. His first term as mayor began April 1876....Dodge City was incorporated November 1875 with an appointed mayor, Pettis L. Beatty. Other elected positions were as a state legislator, city councilman and Ford County Commissioner.

**Per Schillingberg, Dodge City, The Early Years, 1876-1886, pg 167: “....another oddity surrounding George Hoover’s election. When he became mayor, Hoover was not yet a citizen of the United States, but still a Canadian subject. True, he had filed his Declaration of Intent on January 30, 1874, but the mayor did not complete the citizenship process until June 27, 1878. By then he was out of office.”

G) Per Dykstra/Manfra, Dodge City and the Birth of the Wild West, “George Hoover, Dodge City’s very first businessman, turns out to have been its (Dodge City’s) most financially astute. He invested his profits from liquor wholesaling in a loan company specializing in good-value farm mortgages, which at the turn of the century morphed into a prosperous state bank.”

(H) Per Dykstra/Manfra: “Before his death, incidentally, he still had not come to terms with Kansas prohibition. After business hours—‘rain or shine,’ it was said—Hoover and fellow founding entrepreneur Richard Evans would meet a few friends in the back room of Jacob Bloom’s ice cream parlor for a round or two of whiskey toddies. Evans died in 1912. Hoover July 14, 1914.”

Margaret died earlier in March 1914. With no direct heirs, Hoover left endowments to local Dodge City institutions as well as extended family members that included brothers and sisters. One endowment of \$100,000 to the City of Dodge City is still used today for city beautification. He left a bequest of \$10,000 to establish a meeting place known as Hoover Pavilion even today. He is quoted as saying, “I made my money in Dodge, and I’ll leave it here.”
